Andromache Karakatsanis was born in Toronto. She was educated in Toronto and obtained her Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in English Literature from the University of Toronto in 1977. She was granted a Bachelor of Laws Degree (LL.B.) from Osgoode Hall Law School in 1980. After her call to the Bar of Ontario in 1982, she served as a Law Clerk to the Court of Appeal for Ontario. Justice Karakatsanis

was appointed a judge of the Superior Court of Justice in November 21, 2002. She was appointed a judge of the Court of Appeal for Ontario on March 26, 2010 and appointed to the Supreme Court of Canada on October 21, 2011.
